CGC also offers evidence-based practices training of PCIT, TF-CBT, PEERS, and EMDR. CGC also collaborates with four nonprofits to form Strong Families, Strong Children to provide counseling and resources to military families.

Children’s Crisis Residential Program

Short-term crisis intervention homes for youth ages 12-17 referred by Orange County Health Care Agency Children and Youth Behavioral Health Services. The Programs provide a “safe respite” and immediate services to teens displaying behaviors or a history indicative of SED, experiencing significant familial conflict, and/or who are at-risk of hospitalization and/or out-of-home placement.

The Children and Family Services Division

Provides services designed to protect children from abuse and neglect, and provides services to at risk families. SSA staff and community partners work to strengthen and stabilize families in order to create an environment where children are free from abuse in permanent, nurturing homes. Our children have experience trauma which results from an event, series of events, or set of circumstances that is experienced by an individual as physically or emotionally harmful or life threatening and that has lasting adverse effects on the individual's functioning and mental, physical, social, emotional, or spiritual well-being. The Social Workers make every effort to maintain children in their own homes; but out-of-home placement is sought for children who cannot remain safely with their parents. Reunification services are offered in the majority of cases. When reunification is not possible, a permanent plan is developed for the child.

The Children and Family Services – CONT.

ELIGIBILITY

In order for the agency to intervene, a child abuse needs to be generated which rises to the level of CPS intervention. CPS responds to a CPS call and makes an assessment as to whether to deem the report; unfounded, inconclusive or substantiated. The social worker also assesses what the family needs and will provide community resources to meet their needs.
